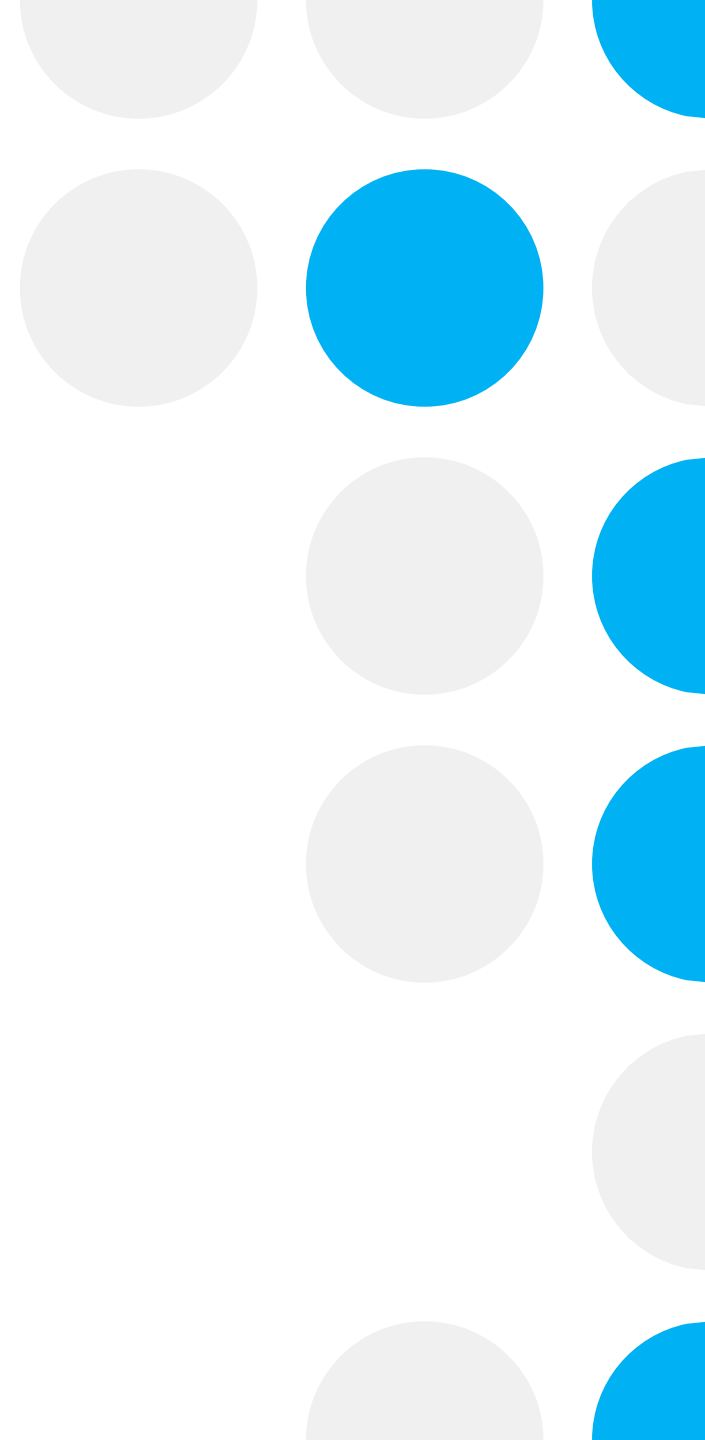

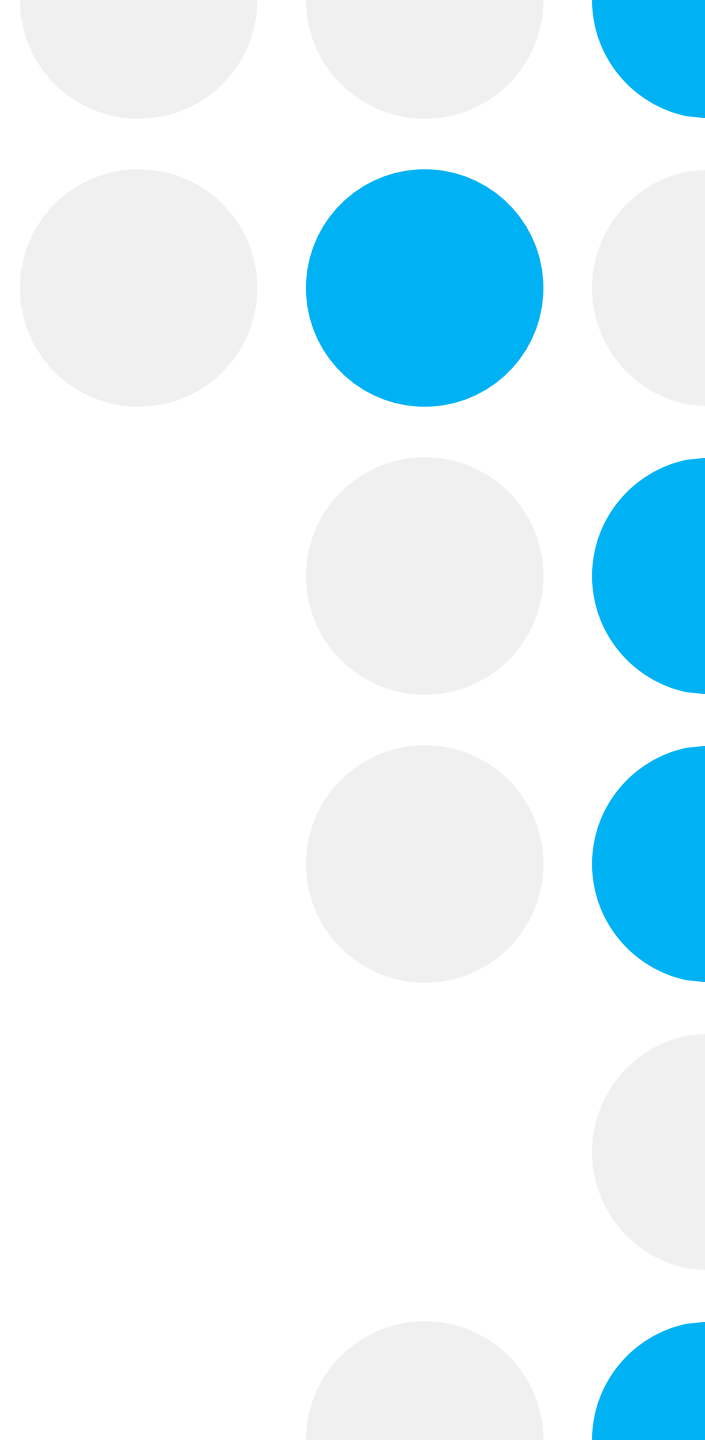
Bid writing and commissioned service experience

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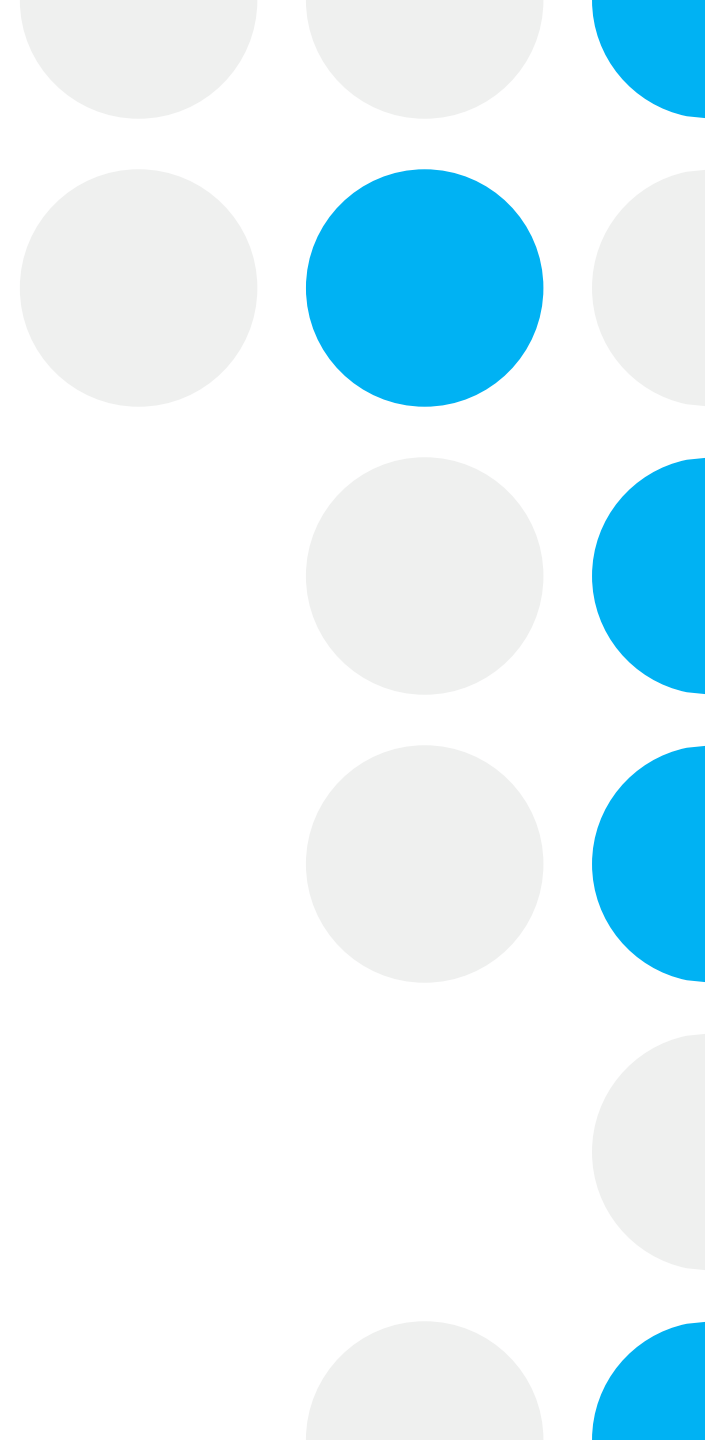


The remit

To produce reliable District headline data for Kent Community Foundation (KCF) to guide targeted grant-making more effective across 4 key themes:

- 1. Children, young people & families**
- 2. Elderly & isolated**
- 3. Employability, enterprise & skills**
- 4. Vulnerable adults**

To produce a resource that everyone can access and use systematically, and which helps KCF to tell a story about need across the county, and to make more insightful grant-making.



The proposal

- Consultation
 - Data Collection
 - Interim Presentation of findings to KCF
 - Evidence-based outcomes review
 - Analysis by district
 - Feedback from stakeholders
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The methodology – data collection

- Gather existing local datasets
 - Look at existing datasets from large charities to inform specific themes
 - Seek data to back up anecdotal claims/emerging themes
 - Look at District Councils, CCGs, Health and Wellbeing Boards, Kent Association of Headteachers, Housing associations and other district networks to identify District trends
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The challenge

- Areas of deprivation were top of the leagues across many data sets
- Areas with minimal deprivation but larger inequality differentials
- The raft of collected data – different geographies; different timescales; different methodologies; different age groups
- Census 2011 / census 2021
- COVID-19 – affected everyone in some way, moving targets
- Sustainability and relevance of the work – like painting the Forth Rail Bridge



The methodology – making sense of the data

- Used the KCF 4 key priorities to ‘bundle’ data sets, organising them under the priorities to make broader sense of the issues.
 - Identified key issues that were rising, prevalent trends across the whole of Kent and Medway including :
 - Substance misuse
 - Mental health
 - Domestic abuse
 - Low income/benefits
 - Food poverty
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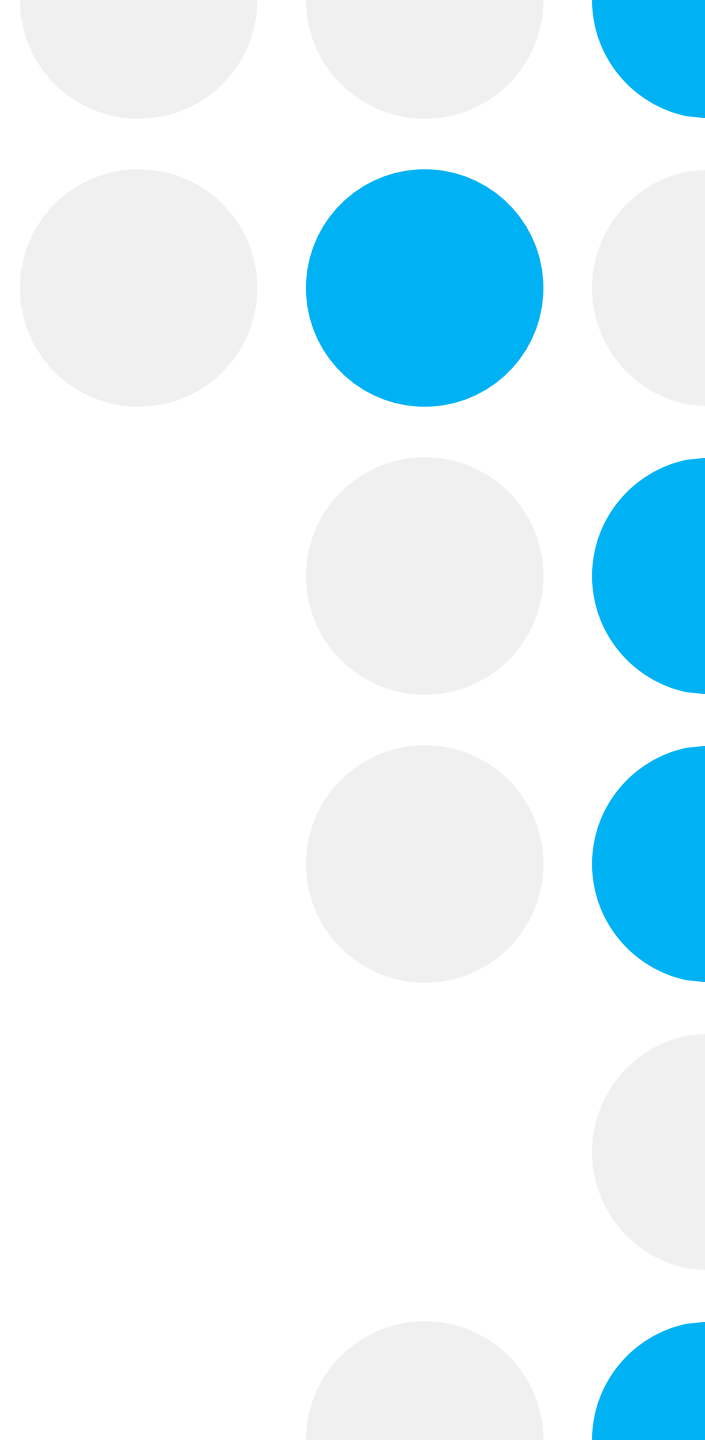
What next – the Perfect Storm?
